

However you spend this Christmas season may it be a time of unexpected happiness, joy and comfort, blessed with the peace of the Christ child.

Avian Influenza (Bird Flu)

On 17 October 2022 an Avian Influenza Prevention Zone was declared by the Government across the whole of England. This was because of the increased number of cases of the disease across the country. All bird keepers (whether they have pet birds, commercial flocks or just a few birds in a backyard) are now required by law to take a range of precautions to protect their flocks. (Jeyes fluid is a Defra approved disinfectant for Avian Influenza). There are minimum requirements for all bird keepers to follow. 080.3 It was agreed that if a parishioner needed the services of Dream A Way or requested that the parish council donate then further discussions about donating would be had.

080.4 Clerk to contact the dog warden about excessive dog mess in the Town Farm Lane area.

Clerk to report the two potholes outside of Stapley cottage.

Details on diversions for the proposed resurfacing works will be requested by the Clerk.

080.5 In agreement with the landowner, the PC has agreed to fund the purchase of five replacement fever trees, the Wildlife Wardens will fund the purchase of stock fencing and Cllr M Batting will donate a roll of wire.

080.6 Clerk to arrange for The Pound to be de-silted before investigation is carried out into why the Millennium Green brook is running dry.

080.7 Following feedback received from those visiting the Sustainable Ideford stand at the fete, it was revealed that what matters most to parishioners is protecting the local environment; the group realise they have a lot to do and are planning an energy roadshow and maybe a booklet. Swift boxes have been built and will be installed in the church. A grant from TDC has funded wildflower seed to be planted on an area of ground in St Mary's Churchyard.

The Sustainable Ideford page is now live on the PC website.

080.8 The Wildlife Wardens reported that the PCC had agreed for part of the land at the church to be used for a wildflower area and youth use. The Wardens will liaise with friends of Diana Forster to plant a tree in her memory.

Unfortunately, there will be no free trees giveaway this year, but it will go ahead next year.

A letter to be written to TDC CEO and Head of Planning to complain about the failure of the process to protect Devon hedges and the reasons why the enforcement for 20/00295/ENF was not upheld.

The Planning Committee dealt with your local site which was the subject of the removal of a Devon Hedge against the Hedgerow Regulations and without permission. The head of planning recommended no action be taken. Further correspondence, after the hearing, revealed that the officer who attended to look at the position was shortly after taken ill and still remains off sick. After a period of enquiries from the village it was indicated that nothing had been done to replace the hedge because it was the wrong time to plant trees, but an eye would be kept on the situation. Eventually it appears that a different tree expert advised no action be taken. There was considerable concern by the planning committee, some of whom had also experienced similar damage to hedgerows and not succeeded in reinstatement. There is a review committee which is looking at future procedures for the Council and it was recommended that they look at matters with issues of this sort. However, the recommendation by planners that No Action be taken was endorsed because of the recommendation of the other arboriculturist. It appears that no further procedure is available to challenge the decision. Research by the District Council Network nationally suggests that rising costs means budgets will have serious pay pressures and shortfalls. Teignbridge is considering changes to Council procedures similar to those being addressed by other Councils at this time. The purpose appears to be to make local councils more business-like and give more powers to Town Clerks and Staff on minor matters, such as replacement of bins, repair to park seats etc. rather than bringing everyday incidents to the council for decision. Also, to reduce the number and time spent by councillors at meetings on routine concerns which could be dealt with as they occur. Cause for much discussion!

Looking for light in the darkness: seasonal reflections from Revd Jane Frost

Haven't the Autumn colours been stunning? Dog walking late on in early winter afternoons has been lifted by glimpses in the gathering gloom of golden beech leaf canopies & shrubs that appear to be blushing deeply, locally. The putting back of clocks was the usual waymarker moment and caused me, at last, to replace a spent light bulb in the ceiling lights of my study. It was also a case of relocating torches. Some of our Devon villages can be impenetrably dark in the Winter months although star gazing without artificial light pollution is a distinct advantage in more rural pockets.

As in all spheres of human life, in this last season, darkness in a metaphorical sense has been part of the experience of a significant number of people in the 6 geographical parishes which make up the Haldon Mission Community. As you read this letter, whether you come to church or not, you might be one of them: impacted by loss, ill health, adverse circumstance. 'Light' may have seemed a rare commodity...then, perhaps something or someone brought it to you. One of the strengths of living in communities is having a friend, a neighbour, a family member to travel with on a gritty road through a dark time.

Not so long ago, I was given an unexpected gift – a book of paintings. Through it, I have really enjoyed re-meeting Holman Hunt's picture 'The Light of the World'. It depicts the adult Jesus, standing outside a closed door...knocking...waiting. The door has no keyhole; no cracks through which light can filter from the lantern Jesus carries; no handle on the outside which can be turned and opened. Perhaps it is re-materialising in your imagination as you read on. You may know it is a painting full of symbolism. The door, for example, represents the human heart. Its handle is therefore within us from Hunt's point of view.

His painting reminds the onlooker that we are invited to take the initiative; to let the Light of the World in.

As we embark on all that January, this New Year threshold month, holds, known and unknown, my hope and prayer for 2023 would be that we can all catch sight of and hold onto a handful of light in the darkness.

A polite request - if you are intending to use fireworks please let other parishioners know by posting a notice on social media, or placing a notice on the notice board, so that owners can take steps to reduce the stress on their animals. Thank you.

Fever Trees Restoration

Come and help restore a famous Ideford landmark!

The Fever Trees stand on high ground to the west of Town Farm and are visible from many points in the village. They are thought to mark the spot where plague victims were buried in the Middle Ages, because the Church authorities would not allow them to be buried in the churchyard.



These days, it might be more accurate to talk of the Fever Tree, because only one tall Scots Pine has survived and even that has suffered lightning damage (there are also two small ones).

The Parish Council has agreed with the Wildlife Wardens that five new trees should be planted, to restore this landmark to its former glory. C is for Christmas

Christmas - so commercialised, so expensive, so wasteful.....but we love it!

Here are a few ideas to make Christmas more sustainable.



If your **Christmas tree** is fake try to make it last 10 years. Don't buy a new one. Instead try buying a potted tree with roots that you can retain in a large pot or replant in your garden. After Christmas, if the tree does not have roots, get it recycled and turned into wood chips. Check with Teignbridge Council website for details.

Upcycle the old **decorations** or make your own using spare material from around the house. Use LED tree lights and remember to switch them off at night. Avoid plastic decorations (unless you are going to reuse them each year) and avoid glitter which is made of plastic.

Choose FSC certified products (Forest Stewardship Council) for cards, paper and crackers. These products enable consumers to choose wood, paper and other forest products with materials made from well managed/sustainable forests and plantations.

Cards - It is estimated that one billion Christmas cards end up in the bin each year. Could you cull the list? Consider donating to a charity instead. Make sure you recycle your cards after Christmas.

Check out your **Christmas present** list. Many people under pressure of time or money might be very happy if a 'Kids' Presents Only' or a 'Secret Santa' for the wider family is suggested.

If you're not sure your recipient will like it don't buy it. Try a gift card or gift an experience, a membership or an "adopt an animal scheme". Try to buy gifts with little or no packaging. If you must use packaging, use recycled paper. Avoid plastic ribbon or tape or foil backed wrapping paper. Avoid sellotape. You could try Washi tape instead (Amazon or Etsy). Use last years' cards (or keep this years) to cut up and use as labels next year.

Crackers are not the planet's friend. They are often shipped in from China and filled with plastic items that get thrown away before Christmas is even over. Try doing without or making your own and filling them with sustainable options (like chocolate or other festive favours) or try reusable crackers. (www.keeprthiscracker.com).
