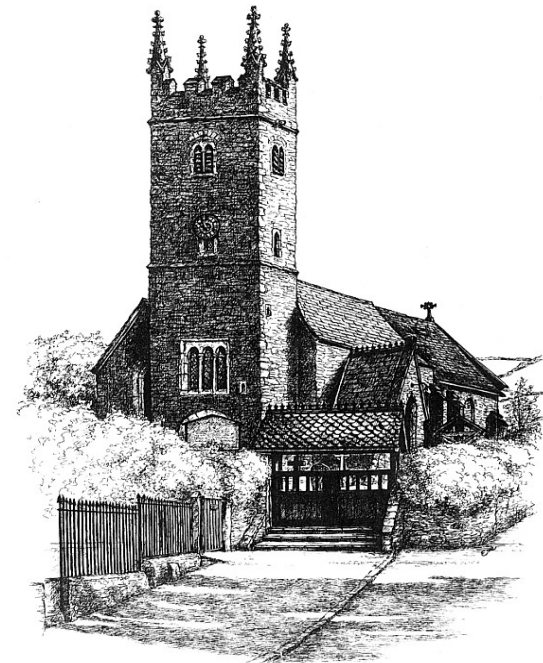

**Candlemas**

Within the Christian liturgical year February celebrates the Festival of Candlemas, or to give it its more modern name, the Feast of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple. This Festival is such a pivotal moment in the Christian calendar. It is the point at which we turn from the coming of God's gift of his Son to the world [celebrated at Christmas] towards God's gift of redemption and salvation through his Son for the world. This journey through the season of Lent climaxing in the services held during Holy Week, Good Friday towards the light and glory of the risen Christ on Easter Day.

The Feast of Candlemas introduces us to the vivid story of Anna, the 84-year-old prophetess, who prayed day and night in the Temple; and to Simeon, a faithful servant of God as a priest in the Temple. In a country occupied by a foreign power, within Luke's Gospel the reader is informed that both Anna and Simeon become excited by the sight of this baby. Jesus was just a baby brought to the Temple by his parents, as was the custom of their Jewish ritual of thanksgiving. Anna began to praise God and 'to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem'. This account also records the supreme joy expressed by a faithful man as he encountered God's revelation of the long promised Messiah. Simeon's response is now known as the Nunc Dimittis: '..... for mine eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel'. For us to remember that Simeon's Song of Worship occurred in response to the extraordinary presence of the long promised Messiah as he was revealed to two very faithful people of prayer.

In the good news given by John the Evangelist, it states: 'The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it'. It is announcing how Jesus, as the 'The Light of the World', can reveal to us afresh the mighty presence and power he brings that can enable each one of us to rise above the chaos and darkness of this world in which we live today.

The Latin word februum, from which the month of February was named, means 'purification'. Brian Doerksen wrote: 'purify our hearts, cleanse us from within and make us holy'. He published 'Refiner's fire' in 1990, and this song of worship is based on the Old Testament passage from Malachi, appointed within the liturgy for Candlemas services. Like Malachi, we too can encounter the light and glory of the risen Christ. It is the call today for us to take time to pray in faith like Anna and Simeon, enabling us to grow in our Christian discipleship, and then to be sent out to serve the people of Devon with joy.

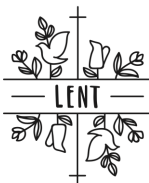

## Grit bins



Grit bins are provided on roads that are not normally treated. They are intended for use on the public highway and **not** on private drives and paths. Grit bins are re-filled when Devon County Council (DCC) are made aware that they are empty.

You can report an empty grit bin by visiting the DCC Report a Problem page. You can also use this page to see the locations of grit bins and to report a damaged bin or a bin with contents that are unusable. Alternatively, you can contact the DCC Roads and Transport team on 0345 155 1004. You will need to provide a clear location and if there is a label inside the bin lid please also provide the reference number found on the label.

## Ideford Parish Council are looking for a Snow Warden to help the community during severe weather.

In winter, DCC focus on salting the major routes that carry the most traffic. This sometimes means smaller communities don't receive as much help as they would like. During times of extreme weather, through the Snow Warden Scheme DCC will provide advice, training and salt to community groups and parish councils who are helping each other on a voluntary basis. The Snow Warden is the key point of contact between DCC and the local community.

Snow Wardens are volunteers from the local community who:



- Give up their spare time to help clear snow during adverse weather
- Clear snow from footpaths
- Spread and lay grit/salt to stop ice forming
- Are willing to attend a short training course at DCC

101 Call Waiting Times-101 or PI [Priority 1] none-emergency calls are those calls that are identified by the interactive Voice Response [VR] system as high priority. These include calls relating to domestic abuse, sexual offences, hate crime, missing persons, and road safety. In the year to July 2022, the average wait time on the PI line was 17 minutes - this is an increase of 11 minutes 57 seconds when compared to the baseline year the 12 months to July 2020. Unsurprisingly, fewer calls have been received in the latest period, fewer answered and a higher abandonment rate is evident.

Waste: Starting on Monday 3rd October for three weeks, a Waste Composition Analysis of residual waste bins is underway across the county. 1,800 residual bins will be examined and will give an indication of which materials are in them, A similar project was carried out some 7/8 years ago with some enlightening and surprising results.

Recycling Rates 21/22 Devon County Council has retained its place as 2nd highest performing Waste Disposal Authority [WDA] in the country at 55.3% Covid

As the weather cools down, COVID is heating up. Over the past three weeks those patients in our local hospitals [Derriford, RD&E, Torbay, and North Devon] diagnosed with COVID, numbers have moved up steadily from 51 to 138 to 185 so we are in a changeable position, thankfully we have not seen a corresponding rise of patients in Intensive Care with, just 2 on mechanical ventilation.

### District Councillor Beryl Austen

The boundary Commission for England is redrawing Boundaries in order to rebalance the number of electors represented by each MP. Consultations are now being held. This usually results in local wards also being reshaped in view of the amount of new housing in local communities and, because of the large amount of new housing in our District, it is likely that once again our wards will be changed. Hoping it will not mean changes to Ideford.

The local Royal British Legion is offering financial help to members of the armed forces Particulars on their website.

The Councillors Community Fund is still available to Councillors for help with projects being organised by their wards. Funding still available if needed.

The Teignbridge Lottery started this week. Each ticket has a 1 in 50 chance of a prize with a top prize of £25,000. The first draw will be on December 3rd. 50p from each ticket will go to good causes and 10p will be placed in a fund to distribute to local projects at the end of each year.

Teignbridge recognises the need for a new look at the whole budgeting system due to changes in funding nationally and locally. Changes have been made to disabled parking concessions and other parking charges increased. More changes unfortunately to come.

Meetings of the District are still being held away from Ford House due to the continuing work on the premises to make those carbon free. However, there seems to be a new look to meetings and the Council does not have these as often as was customary before the lockdown was introduced. Frequently those due to take place are cancelled. One wonders also, with so many staff working from home, if it will ever go back to its original form. The current system has revealed savings in costs of travel and office expenses.

<b>091/22</b>	<p><b>REPORTS</b>  <b>County Councillor Ron Peart</b>  Police: We have a new Chief Constable.  The Police &amp; Crime Panel endorsed the appointment of DCC Will Kerr OBE. He is currently Deputy Chief Constable for Police Scotland.  A very experienced officer, before Scotland he held senior appointments in the Police Service of Northern Ireland and the National Crime Agency.  Hate Crime- 2,564 hate crimes were recorded in the 12 months to June 2022. This is a 46% increase [+800] when compared to the baseline year, the 12 months to June 2019. Despite the observed increase, it is difficult to make objective inferences about performance based on increase, or decreases in hate crime-victims may be more confident to report to the police. Conversely, the trend could also be interpreted as negative because it could be reflective of a 'real' increase in victimisation. 44% of all hate crimes were public order related and these were predominantly racially or religiously aggravated</p>

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Sustainable Ideford:</b>  <b>D is for Driving</b></p> <p>Living in a village with no public transport, we inevitably cause significant carbon dioxide emissions through driving. Action on Climate in Teignbridge (ACT) is an organisation set up to help Teignbridge Council follow through on its Climate Emergency Declaration, and estimates that 11% of Ideford emissions are from this source. So what can we do to reduce them?</p> <p>Gradually, we will all have to get used to electric cars – in seven years time, no new petrol or diesel cars will be on the market. Several Ideford residents have gone electric: the experience of two of our group are described on page 10. We'd be interested to hear how other EV drivers have got on – tell us via Facebook or in the next issue of the News.</p> <p>There was a time when the Government provided a discount on buying an EV and a grant to fit a fast-charger at home (you can use a normal 13 amp socket, but it's slower). Sadly, these subsidies have mostly been withdrawn, but it's worth watching out for new ones.</p> <p>If you're not ready to make the leap to electric yet, are there other ways to cut your driving emissions, and save money on fuel? Driving style can make quite a difference: much less petrol is used coming up Telegraph Hill at 40 mph than at 60. Driving more smoothly, with less severe braking and acceleration certainly helps, as does keeping your tyres at the right pressure. It's estimated that having tyres at 28psi when they should be at 35 will increase fuel consumption by 4%, equivalent to a price increase of 6p a litre. ## Two Ideford residents share their experience of low-emission cars

We have driven a Prius hybrid for many years and now have an all-electric car as well, a ten-year-old Nissan Leaf.

After making the initial investment, we have saved a great deal of money. Before the price of electricity spiked, the Leaf was costing about 4p a mile, compared to about 12p for a petrol car doing 50 miles to the gallon. It also has low servicing costs – no exhaust replacement or oil change – and the battery is still as good as when we bought it. Even at current fuel prices (hopefully temporary) the Leaf costs about 8.5p a mile, compared to 15p for petrol. Because this is an old model, it only has a range of 70 miles, so we just use it for short journeys. New electric cars, even small ones, have a range of 200 miles and more.

The hybrid is the plug-in type. This means that you can charge it at home and get about 30 miles on the battery alone – great for shopping trips – but on a long journey the car switches to hybrid mode, which gives us about 70 mpg and a range of 600 miles. Since we bought the car, we have done about 50,000 miles at 100 mpg (not counting the electricity used when we plug in at home). We are enthusiastic about electric vehicles!

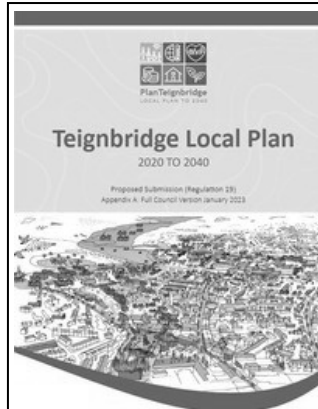

Residents have seven weeks to comment for the fifth and last time on Teignbridge's draft Local Plan which will shape future development in the district until 2040.

The launch of the consultation, which runs until midday on Monday 13 March, concludes a local engagement process that began in 2017 and has resulted in the latest version of the Plan being influenced by the 7,000 plus comments submitted in the previous four consultations.

Once the consultation ends, the draft Plan and all comments received will be submitted for examination in public by the planning inspectorate. Anyone who submits a written objection will have a legal right to appear before and be heard by the Inspector at the Local Plan Examination Hearing.

Throughout the seven-week consultation, copies of the Local Plan documentation - including a summary Need to Know guide - will be available in libraries, town and parish council offices, Forde House and on the Teignbridge website.
