



Reflections on the coming of spring, from Revd Elizabeth Burren

I write this on a cold grey day in February, and it seems impossible to imagine that when you read it, in early March, we will be seeing daffodils, green leaves on the trees, and sunshine. Of course, this is England, so it might still be raining! I guess the point is that even though we wait, some years longer than others, springtime always comes with its new life and new possibilities.

Life can be like this, can't it? Harder seasons come and go, and sometimes stay around longer than we thought they would. Sometimes it may seem as if winter will never end. But somehow, eventually, the light breaks through.

We are in the season of Lent, and this is when we in the church remember a hard time that Jesus went through. Forty days of heat, and thirst, and testing in the wilderness. The bible tells us that, because Jesus suffered and was tested himself, he is able to help us in our times of trial.

Sometimes we fast during Lent, which historically has been a way for believers to share, in a very small way, in the sufferings Jesus went through. Fasting isn't always about food, it could be fasting from social media, alcohol, watching too much telly, anything really but it needs to be something we like - if it's not a sacrifice, it doesn't count! Doing this can draw us closer to the one who gave up everything for us.

Of course, it's not just Christians who give something up during Lent. It's a tradition in this country and lots of us do it, for all sorts of reasons; to be healthier, save a bit of money, or just to test ourselves, and see if we can stick it out. And it's not just giving things up either, the sacrifice can be a bit of time to start doing something new. This year, I'm planning to sacrifice a bit of sofa time each day to go for a walk, appreciate the goodness of creation, and get a bit healthier in body, mind and spirit.

So what are you doing, in this season of the year? If you have begun a Lenten fast of any kind, may you be blessed by it. If you'd like to, it's not too late; you can begin today. If you are just enjoying the brighter days and the new growth in the garden, then that's a blessing in itself. And if you are in your own hard time, and it seems that winter will never end, know that you are loved, and spring is just around the corner.

A reminder of the **Public Space Protection Order (PSPO)** aimed at reducing irresponsible dog ownership and making Teignbridge an even cleaner and greener place.



From 1 April 2019 you have to:

- pick up after your dog in public places
- not walk your dog on some beaches from 1 April to 30 September
- keep your dog out of areas signed as dog exclusion areas (for example, children's play parks)
- keep your dog on a fixed 1 metre lead (which includes a fixed extendable lead) in certain areas
- keep your dog on a fixed 1 metre lead (which includes a fixed extendable lead) when walking next to a road, on a footpath next to the road or on a cycle path
- where a dog is being a nuisance or annoying to people or other animals, you must put your dog on a lead if asked to do so by a council officer or police officer
- limit the amount of dogs you have with you to a maximum of six (this applies to professional dog walkers too)
- You must carry sufficient dog poo bags

Failure to comply may result in a Fixed Penalty Notice or Prosecution

A trial to salt some of Exeter's busiest cycle routes will also be extended to continue to provide additional support for communities as part of the Council's winter self – help scheme. The 325 volunteer snow wardens across the county treat their priority routes during prolonged spells of severe weather.

The Teignbridge Lottery has attracted the sale of 1000 tickets and more than 50 good causes have signed up to benefit from the new fund-raising opportunity. The first draw will be on Dec.3rd. For every ticket sold 50p will go to good causes with 10p. to local projects.

A scheme to provide housing for social rent, with the special criteria that anyone with a local connection can register for tenancy, has been launched for Widecombe. It is proposed that eight properties will be built by 2023 for local people. This is a project which many small places would welcome as one of the problems of housing is that young people have to leave their birthplace to be housed elsewhere.

Teignbridge is having to consider increasing drivers pay levels to current market rates to cover the loss of driver vacancies. There is a national shortage due to loss of European workers, lack of drivers tests and the ageing workforce.

Because of changes in planning regulations councillors are being offered training to update them on latest regulations.

099/22	WELCOME AND APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE The Chairman opened the meeting at 7:01pm. Apologies were received from Cllr H Bellamy, Cllr J Gardner, Cllr B Austen and D Morby.
100/22	MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING It was proposed by Cllr M Batting, seconded by Cllr A Carter-Woodwork and agreed by all to accept the minutes of the meeting of Thursday 10 th November 2022 as a true and accurate record after amending the wording of 097/22 to: At this point Cllr M Crispin made accusations against Cllr A Carter-Woodwork without providing evidence and this outburst was brought to a close by the Chair. Cllr M Crispin resigned as a Parish Councillor
101/22	COUNCILLOR VACANCY 101.1 The resignation of M Crispin was noted and the Chair thanked her for all that she had done during her time as a Cllr. 101.2 The Cllr vacancy is advertised but as it is less than six months until the elections (and Cllrs are no longer obliged to fill a seat by co-option), it was agreed that the PC would not actively seek to co-opt.
102/22	DECLARATION OF INTERESTS None
103/22	PUBLIC PARTICIPATION A resident confirmed that land outside of Higher Colleybrook was 'no man's land', after being asked not to park there. The first board on the Olchard boardwalk needs the chicken wire replacing and it was asked if a handrail could be installed.
104/22	REPORTS County Councillor Ron Peart Devon's gritting teams have been out for the first time this winter and they're prepared to face whatever the elements throw at the county's road over the next few months. Gritting depots across the county are fully stocked with around 24,000 tonnes of salt and Devon County Council's upgrade of its winter fleet has continued, with eight of its 37 frontline gritters replaced with newer models this year, reducing revenue spend on maintaining outdated vehicles. This winter, Devon's fleet of gritters will be running on sustainably sourced Hydrotreated Vegetable Oil [HVO], which is a waste product from the food industry. The fuel produces 90% less CO2 than a regular diesel which will help meet Devon County Council's net zero targets by 2030.

Sustainable Ideford - 'E For Energy Matters'

Welcome to the latest advice and information from Sustainable Ideford. We are continuing to provide tips and links to information we hope members of our community will find useful, so please do feed back to us with your thoughts on recent articles and future activities you think would be useful. In the near future we will start running open community meetings and events where everyone will be welcome – we will publish details in due course.

For this edition of the News, we are focusing on energy saving. The cost of energy in the home these past few months has become a real issue for all of us – spiralling costs, added inflationary pressure on spending in general and long periods of cold weather. And there may be more price hikes this spring. No doubt many of us are already exploring or putting in place simple actions to limit our energy use. There is plenty of advice out there to help. Some actions are easy and cost nothing.

For example, did you know:

- Turning your combi boiler flow temperature down to 60°C could save you up to £100 a year
- Turning down radiators in rooms you aren't using or use less could save you up to £70 a year
- Turning appliances off at the socket could save you up to £70 a year
- Washing clothes at a lower temperature could save you up to £40 a year
- Using your tumble dryer less could save you £70 a year
- Closing all your curtains and blinds at night
- Only fill the kettle with the water you need – boiling more than you need could lose you up to £25 a year or more

These are just some of the simple things we can do at home to manage how much energy we use on a daily basis.

New grants for hedges

As part of my work as a Wildlife Warden, I have been surveying hedges in the Parish. Hedges are fantastic for wildlife, providing food and shelter, nesting sites for birds and small mammals and corridors by which bats navigate.

We have some substantial hedges in Ideford, most of them with the traditional Devon bank. Also, many of us have shorter hedges in our gardens. How they are managed makes a big difference to their wildlife value: did you know that most hedging trees flower on second-year wood, so if they are cut every year, they never produce the flowers and berries that birds and pollinators need? It's encouraging to see that some hedges here are now being cut every two years, or one side one year and the other the next.

Another problem is that, if a hedge is cut at the same height each year, it develops hard knuckles on top, reducing its ability to make new shoots. Gaps develop and in the long run the hedge will die. The ideal is to let the hedge grow a little taller each year and, after 10-15 years, to lay or coppice it. Easy enough for a garden hedge, but if you have many hundreds of metres to look after, this is a lot of extra work.

However, help is at hand. The Government's recent Environmental Land Management update includes grants of:

- **£13.52 per metre for hedge-laying**
- **£5.33 per metre for coppicing**
- **£17.22 per metre for filling gaps with new trees.**

You don't have to be a farmer to qualify, though your hedge needs to be at least 20 metres long, with at least 80% native shrubs. Farmers are eligible whether or not they are in a Stewardship Agreement.

There is also support for **planting new hedges, at £22.97 per metre**. But the hedge would have to link to an existing hedgerow or be on the site of a historical one. Similarly, the Woodland Trust will pay 75% of the cost of a new hedge, but only where it connects to woodland, directly or via an existing hedge.
