There Is Another in the Fire.

This winter has held two very different realities side by side.

We have shared the joy of Christmas - candles lit, carols sung, and the good news of Emmanuel proclaimed once again: God with us. And yet, across our communities, there have also been many funerals. For some, this new year will be without someone deeply loved. It can feel as though we are walking through fire as we navigate this new reality.

A worship song, **Another in the Fire** by Hillsong United, has stayed with me this year. One line says, *“There’s a grace when the heart is under fire.”* Not grace that removes the fire, but grace that meets us within it.

In the **Book of Daniel** chapter 3, Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego are thrown into a blazing furnace for not worshipping the king’s statue. The miracle is not just that they survive, but that another is seen walking beside them in the flames. The fire still burns - but they are not alone.

The Christian faith does not promise a life without fire. It promises presence. A God who does not stand at a distance, but steps into suffering - into the furnace, and ultimately onto the cross.

So if this season finds you joyful, may you give thanks.
If it finds you weary or grieving, may you know that your tears are seen.
Whether we feel strong or barely holding on, the promise remains the same: nothing stands between us and God’s love for us - not grief, not loss, not even death itself.

There is, and always will be, **another in the fire.**

St. Mary's now has wi-fi


St. Mary's PCC are really pleased to let everyone know that the church now has free wi-fi.

Councillors reviewed open spaces, parish paths, repair contingencies, computer costs, depreciation assumptions, grant allocations, staff costs, and mileage budgeting. It was agreed to take the figures home for further review and finalise the budget at the December meeting.

06.07 Website The clerk thanked Cllrs Gardner and Cllr C Hill for their ongoing feedback. Councillors agreed that continuous feedback helps ensure accuracy and completeness of the website.

07/10/25 PLANNING: 7/11/25 PLANNING:

07.01 Planning Applications: No new applications were received.

07.02 Planning Decisions: The Colleybrook Barns application was approved with conditions relating to permitted development restrictions, drainage, downpipes, planters, and ecology. Updated bat surveys were submitted, and mitigation now focuses on providing roof-space habitat. Councillors expressed disappointment that parish concerns were not fully addressed and noted that the planning authority's response was limited.

07.03 Planning Appeals: No appeals were reported

08/10/25 CONCERNS RAISED BY PARISHIONERS TO COUNCILLORS - Concerns

were raised about bird flu and uncertainty among residents regarding enforcement and biosecurity requirements. APHA guidance has been shared online on facebook. Councillors emphasised the importance of housing birds under mandatory rules for flocks over 50 birds, or any flock where eggs are sold or given away. The wider issue was the Spanish flu killing 18 million people over a 100 years ago, which was bird flu that affected people.

A few horse riders have been affected by loose dogs from the boarding kennels. Ideford residents dogs have run home from this location and a neighbour was bitten. A discussion over the matter occurred and secure fencing which should be referred to Teignbridge Council

09/10/25 CLERK'S REPORT AND FINANCE: The bank balance at the end of

October was £16,852.14. Expenditure for the month totalled £556.05. Potential CIL receipts may arrive before year-end. Councillors discussed transferring a sum into an interest-bearing account; the clerk will check current rates and proceed once confirmed. Next years meeting dates were approved

Devon Air Ambulance

Resuscitation and Defibrillator Training

Saturday 11th April
2.00pm - 3.30pm



The Devon Air Ambulance have kindly offered to provide resuscitation and defibrillator training at the Village Hall on Saturday afternoon 11th April. This training is free to participants.

We have a defibrillator on site at the Village Hall so this provides a welcome opportunity to learn how to use it in times of need. It is not complicated as the machine talks you through the actions required giving confidence in what would be a stressful scenario. Anybody can learn the technique required. So if you would like the knowledge and an opportunity to practise on a Machine, book a place by e-mailing Idefordvillagehall@yahoo.com without delay or contacting Angela Fox on 01626 859599.(answer phone if out).

Last time training was organised with another group they cancelled at the last minute. The training date is guaranteed this time.

CPR

Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation

Before you approach the person who has collapsed, check your surroundings for danger.

- 1 Shout for help.**
 Gently shake the person who has collapsed.
- 2 Look and listen for signs of normal breathing.**
 Look for the rise and fall of their chest.
- 3 Call 999. | 999**
 Put the phone on loudspeaker and tell them you are with someone who is not breathing.

Brief instruction notes from the Devon Air Ambulance Magazine, but please book your place for the full training session on April 11th.

- 4 Start chest compressions.**
 · Interlock your fingers.
 · Place your hands in the centre of the chest.
 · Push down hard and then release twice per second, and don't stop.
 · The ambulance call handler will help you.
- 5 Is there a defibrillator available?**
 The ambulance call handler will tell you where the nearest automated external defibrillator (AED) is. If someone is with you, ask them to fetch it and bring it back. Do not leave the person if you are on your own.
- 6 If you have a defibrillator, switch it on and follow the instructions.**
 The defibrillator will tell you exactly what to do.
- 7 Continue CPR.**
 Continue giving CPR until:
 · The AED asks you to pause while it reanalyses and gives another shock if needed.
 · A paramedic arrives and tells you what to do.
 · The person shows signs of life.

06.01 cont.

Footpaths were also discussed - non-slip strips have been applied at Muddy Bottom Way, however there is still a big gap. The chair will consult with Mr. S. Gardner and outstanding work on paths leading to the Common.

06.02 Sustainable Ideford: Mr. Aaronson (WW) reported, new planters have been installed at the Luton end of the village, with matching planters planned at the other end of the village. Planters by the grit box protrude onto the road and had already been hit. A suggestion was made to set them back slightly. Bulbs have been planted by the oak tree at the pub, and two replacement rowan trees are proposed for the churchyard (subject to PCC approval), to replace three that have died. Mr. Aaronson, has an additional set of saplings to strengthen the existing hedging in the church. Councillors were reminded that the PCC must apply formally to the diocese for permission before any new trees are planted in the churchyard.

06.03 Policy Review: The grant policy review was deferred until the next meeting as councillors had not yet seen the final version.

06.04 The recent village litter pick was successful, collecting six full sacks of litter, four of them from the area around Ideford Arch and the A380 bridge. Thanks were expressed to the vice chair for providing refreshments and to all volunteers. Teignbridge supplied equipment was helpful, though of lower quality than parish owned items. Longthorne Road, the A380 lay-by, and the bridge area remain persistent problem locations. Councillors will consider replacing damaged signage and may contact Environmental Officer Rob Harvey for advice.

06.05 Updates from the last meeting An update was also provided regarding the boundary stone shared with surrounding parishes. There has been no progress since the stone, bench, and signage were damaged during Forestry Commission operations. Concerns were raised about replacement costs, particularly as the original stonemason is no longer available. The Forestry Commission has accepted liability, and councillors remain keen to ensure full reinstatement.

Dog-related concerns were discussed, including incidents involving escape-prone dogs at Larkham Barn, possible licensing issues, and safety concerns for walkers and horse riders. Councillors agreed that matters should be referred to Teignbridge District Council for inspection.

A separate incident involving two large dogs charging walkers was also noted. Councillors agreed that affected residents should be advised to report incidents to the dog warden (Rob Harvey). PSPO notices will be displayed at key village points.

A brief update was also given on vehicles previously noted without MOT or tax. Several have now been moved. A request for a litter bin on Rixaford Road, information from the district council indicated a lack of evidence of use for a previous approval. A bin for the layby needs to be raised to Chudleigh Parish Council.

06.06 Budget The draft budget was discussed in detail. Last year's actual income was £10,932, though this included one-off items such as CIL and VAT refunds. The baseline precept remains £9,725.

He also noted different preferences among Torbay, Plymouth, and Exeter for combined authority or unitary status. The situation remains uncertain. Kingsteignton residents have been raising concerns about the quarry development and oppose it on environmental matters. Safeguarding concerns arising from recent migrant placements and debates at Teignbridge District Council regarding greater transparency and local pressures. Adoption of the One Teignbridge Strategy Action Plan 2025–2030. Approval of the redevelopment of the Sherbourne House car park to provide 23 energy-efficient social rented homes for vulnerable residents.</p> <p>05.03 Neighbourhood Beat Manager PCSO Bunce’s report recorded one offence in October: a theft of tools. Councillors discussed the PCSO limited ability to attend parish meetings due to shift patterns and town-based policing. Upcoming abolition of PCC elections was also noted, with councillors expressing concern about potential reduction in accountability and the impact on rural policing.</p>
06/10/25	<p>PARISH MATTERS:</p> <p>06.01 Updates on roadworks, highways, parking issues and potholes and discuss: Repair at Ideford Arch is complete. Concerns were raised regarding work along Longthorne Road; markings originally applied suggested more extensive repairs than the small patches completed. Councillors agreed to ask Mr. Matthew to confirm whether the work is considered finished.</p>




